

Teacher guides will not be available online. We understand that students are savvy and look for answers online.

While we are not planning to send out hard-copies of the Data Nuggets to you for the study, if you are concerned about the cost of printing the materials, please contact Val at BSCS.

Q: What do I do if a student doesn't have consent?

A: Students without consent should participate as normal in classroom activities. However, please administer the "ALTERNATIVE TASK FOR NO CONSENT STUDENTS" 1 and 2 activities to them instead of the research surveys.

Q: Do we tell students they are part of a study?

A: Yes, because students need to complete the assent form (and their parent/guardian notified of the study) they will know they are in a study. However, you should not be explicit what treatment they are in. We don't want the kids to fixate on the fact that they are in a study. Some students might figure out that Data Nuggets is different than what their friends in the comparison are doing.

Q: What do I do about students with an IEP/504 accommodations?

A: Please use the BLUE cover assessment for any student that would typically receive accommodations during testing also follow the accommodations provided through their IEP or 504 plan. It is fine if students do not complete the entire form or for them to have extra time to complete the form. We also recognize that some students have tests read to them. This is just fine. Please use the blue form for these students, as well. If you have specific questions about accommodations, please contact Molly.

Q: What if a student is added to my class mid-semester?

A: In every situation, your students should always participate in class, as normal. You are absolutely welcome to send home the consent form and provide them with the assent form. It is not necessary for you to give your student the pre-surveys.

Q: Is it OK to grade the Data Nuggets?

A: Yes, you can use the Data Nuggets as formative or summative assessment, or as a graded activity.

Q: How do classroom visits work?
